On the Afternoon of the Saturday (30th) an optional fieldtrip will visit local medieval sites. The trip will culminate at Brixworth where Lesley Webster (Former Senior Curator of Anglo-Saxon Antiquities at the British Museum) will deliver the Annual the Brixworth Lecture: *Wall-paintings to Altar Cloths; furnishing the Anglo-Saxon Church*.

The cost will be £10. The trip will leave promptly after lunch and return in the evening (c.8.00pm).
