

**Grad Cert/BSc (Hons)

This programme enhances understanding of the effects of work on health and health on work. The role of the occupational health practitioner is explored in relation to health and risk assessment, including compliance with the requirements of health and safety and employment legislation. The potential environmental impact of work processes is incorporated within the BSc programme.

Career opportunities

Programme graduates have excellent career prospects. Students completing these programmes may gain employment in the public or private sectors including airlines, city institutions, within industrial settings and the NHS.

Entry requirements

Normally two years relevant experience and:

60 level 6 CAT points (for the BSc (Hons) programme)

This requirement may be waived for applicants for the Graduate Certificate with appropriate practice experience.

Duration

The Graduate Certificate is completed in one academic year of study. The degree programme can be completed in two years (part-time) or one year (full-time) study.

Simple timetable information

Access to a work area is required to undertake the course assessments. Students will attend for one (full-time) or two days (part-time) each week.

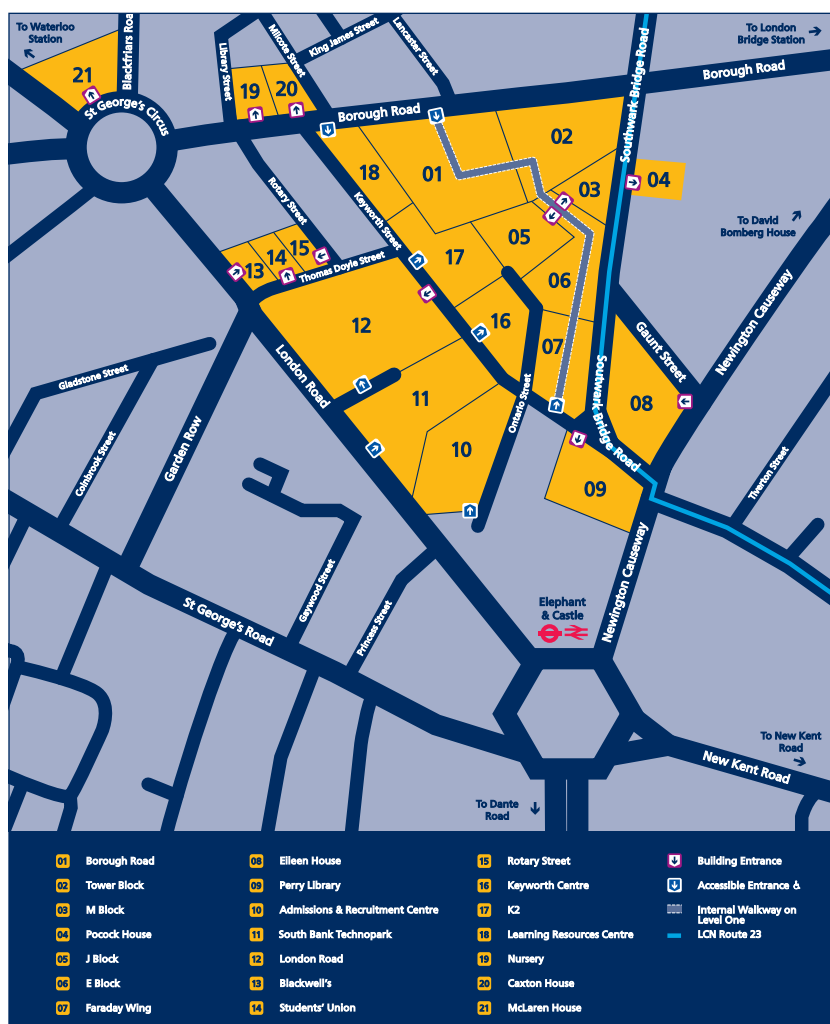
Why LSBU?
