The festival will begin with a screening of James Broughton's *The Pleasure Garden* (1953), winner of the Prix de Fantasie Poetique at Cannes in 1954. This will be followed by a discussion with Elisabeth Bond (screenwriter – *The Assam Garden*) and Tim Anderson (Chair – Friends of Maryon Wilson Park).

2PM CELEBRATING POST-WAR DESIGN AND FILM

There will be talks from Professor Sarah Street (University of Bristol), Claire Smith (BFI) and Alex Goddard (Geffrye Museum) as we explore design through the 1948 Olympic Games, the Festival of Britain in 1951 and the Queen's Coronation in 1953.
