**LSA 2012: Leisure, Living, Learning** is an international assembly of academics, advocates, students, policy-makers and practitioners in sport, tourism and outdoor education. The conference provides a forum for sharing ideas and generating academic debate to inform policy and practice.

Leisure, Living, Learning is designed to make a difference in the world through the generation of learning and practice in global citizenship through sport, tourism and outdoor education.

LSA 2012 focuses on the role of education in sport, tourism and the outdoors to improve quality of life and contribute to sustainable, just and ethical living, learning and working.

**The conference themes are:**

- **Sustainable development** in tourism and education
- **Social justice** in sport development
- **Quality of life** in physical education, health and wellbeing
- **Environmental education** in outdoor learning

**Call for papers** Abstracts are invited for papers that address the conference theme of Leisure, Living, Learning and engage with sport, tourism and/or outdoor education. Abstracts can take one of two forms:

- **Individual Abstracts:** Single abstracts from individuals/co-researchers submitting a paper that addresses the conference theme or themes
- **Group Abstracts:** A set of three abstracts from a group of individuals/co-researchers submitting a coherent set of papers that address the conference themes and which could be scheduled together in one parallel session. [Only one paper per main presenter]

Abstracts will be refereed by the Conference Organising Committee and by a panel of four UK Professors in leisure, sport and tourism: Professor Cara Aitchison, University of Edinburgh; Professor Scott Fleming, University of Wales, Cardiff; Professor John Horne, University of Central Lancashire; and Professor Tess Kay, Brunel University. Where papers demonstrate potential but do not quite meet the required standard, feedback from the refereeing process will be provided together with an opportunity for prospective presenters to revise their abstract and resubmit it to the panel.

## Submission of abstracts

250-350 words according to the following format:

- **Author details:** name, organisation affiliation and contact details for all contributing authors
- **Author biography:** 100-150 words indicating each author's position, field of study, main research interests and key publications where appropriate
- **Title of paper:** full title of paper as it will appear in the conference programme
- **Background:** outline of the policy context and/or academic literature informing the research
- **Approach:** indication of the broad theoretical orientation and/or methodological approach
- **Significance:** description and application of the original research findings reported in the paper
- **References:** bibliographic details of any research cited in the abstract
- Please do not include tables, figures or footnotes in the abstract

**Deadline** Abstracts should be e-mailed by **9th January 2012** to <HoS.Education@ed.ac.uk> with the subject line: "**LSA 2012 Abstract** [insert first-author's surname]" and copied to <myrene.mcfee@leisure-studies-association.info>

**Publication** A set of themed and edited volumes will be produced post-conference and published by Leisure Studies Association.

**Venue** The University of Edinburgh's Moray House School of Education is an international leader in education, community development and sport-related studies with over 200 staff and 3,500 students engaged in a wide range of taught programmes and research.

The John McIntyre Conference Centre is the university's new international conference venue with world-class facilities and adjacent en-suite residential accommodation for conference delegates. The Conference Centre is situated in spectacular surroundings at the foot of Salisbury Crags and 'Arthur's Seat' in Holyrood Park and offers delegates immediate access to a range of green space.

The conference venue is a five-minute walk from many of the city's shops, galleries, bars and restaurants and a ten-minute walk from the world-famous historic Royal Mile stretching from Edinburgh Castle to the Royal Palace of Holyrood. Moray House School of Education, the Scottish Parliament and Our Dynamic Earth are all situated at the foot of the Royal Mile next to Holyrood Park.

**Note** The timing of LSA 2012 allows for the possibility of delegates going on to the 2012 International Convention on Science, Education and Medicine in Sport (ICSEMIS) at the Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre (SECC) in Glasgow from July 19–24.
