Why Minority Ethnic Organ Donation?

- On average, people from minority ethnic groups wait twice as long as the general population for a kidney transplant from a deceased donor.
- When asked, 75% of bereaved families from these groups refuse to donate their deceased relative's organs.

The DonaTE Research Programme, based at King's College London, aims to improve the skills of Intensive Care Unit staff to better support and communicate with families from minority ethnic groups at times of bereavement. **We invite people with the above experiences** to join our Advisory Group to ensure our training package is relevant to diverse groups.
