Digital visual culture in early years education

Saturday 19th January 2013

Picturing Change is a one-day workshop exploring the role of digital visual culture in the formal and informal education of young children. As the screen becomes increasingly prominent in homes and schools as a source of visual stimulation and as a medium for visual exploration, educators and educational researchers must take on the responsibility of understanding how this cultural change will influence the development and learning of young children. *Picturing Change* will be an opportunity to discuss the theories and methods that are best suited to this task, as well as a forum for sharing findings that have been made in the field so far.

Papers are invited on the following topics (though this list is not exhaustive or limiting):

- Photography and film in early years settings
- Digital exposure in the home
- Young children's picture-making on screen
- Interactive whiteboards in early years classrooms
- Digital visual methodologies for researching early childhood
- Practitioners' approaches to the integration of digital media
