Prof. Elizabeth Lira

Clinical psychologist, psychotherapist, psychosocial researcher and Director of Alberto Hurtado University Centre of Ethics (Chile). She previously worked at Instituto Latinoamericano de Salud Mental y Derechos Humanos (ILAS), Facultad Latinoamericana de Ciencias Sociales (FLACSO), Fundación de Ayuda Social de las Iglesias Cristianas (FASIC) and, Instituto Latinoamericano de Doctrina y Estudios Sociales (ILADES). She was a member of the Chilean Commission on Torture and Political Imprisonment (Valech Commission, 2003-5 and 2010-11). Between 2004 and 2006, she was President of FONDECYT-CONICYT. Over the past three decades, Professor Lira has conducted training programs for psychologists treating victims of human rights violations in Chile, El Salvador, Peru, Croatia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Turkey, Spain, and Guatemala. Professor Lira is the recipient of the American Psychological Association International Humanitarian Award (2002), the Martin Diskin Memorial Award (Latin American Studies Association, 2001), the Nevitt Sanford Award (International Society on Political Psychology, 1998), the National Prize from the Chilean Association of Psychologists, the Sergio Yulis Award from the Chilean Society of Clinical Psychology and, the Eclipse Award of the Center for Victims of Torture (2011), for her pioneering work in caring for torture survivors and for her international advocacy in the field of mental health and human rights.
