Fulbright - Elsevier Bibliometric Analysis Award

Fully-funded Scholarships for Postgraduate Study in any interdisciplinary field requiring bibliometric analysis.

Bibliometrics is the quantitative analysis of research output, used, for example, to uncover new research trends, emerging fields of science or collaborations between universities and industry.

Approximately 30 Fulbright scholarships are offered each year to UK citizens for the first year of postgraduate or doctoral study, or for 'special student research'.

Benefits

Scholarships cover tuition fees and provide a living stipend for one academic year. A number of memberships, sickness and accident benefit coverage, and visa sponsorship are also included. There is substantial pre-departure support, including a Finalists Workshop (March) and a 3-day Orientation Programme (July). Once on-the-ground in the US, further support is offered by the Institute of International Education (IIE).

Over 300,000 Fulbright Awards have been given since the Programme's inception, and alumni have the opportunity to stay engaged through our extensive alumni networks, including the British Fulbright Scholar Association (BFSA).

The Application Process:

- Online application (provide biographical information, academic & extracurricular accomplishments & study plans.)
- Indicate one or more institutions (& specific degree programmes, if applicable) applicant has or will apply to in the US, & provide reasons for choosing institute(s).
- A personal statement & study objective statement
- Three letters of recommendations are required.
