- We will demonstrate how **language analysis can improve interviewing technique** and give a greater understanding of how different interviews work.
- We will **focus on the role of interpreters in the interviewing process** and examine some of the problems and myths associated with interpreted interviews.
- We will provide practical suggestions for the **better management of interpreted interviews** and explore the ethical issues this can present to police officers.
