## Lilias Gillies House

Lilias Gillies House is a residential care home for 20 people most of whom have a diagnosis of psychosis or borderline personality disorder. A team of around 10 staff and students work in project. The therapeutic programme is made up of psychotherapy sessions (individual and group) and practical sessions (cooking, cleaning, gardening etc). Clients usually stay for around 18 months and are reviewed at three monthly intervals.

## **Project Manager**

As Project Manager you be the Clinical Lead and act as a dynamic coordinator of a therapeutic community programme. As such you will be responsible for the delivery of psychotherapy, for maintaining a psychoanalytically informed therapeutic environment, supervising staff and students, overseeing research on outcomes, overseeing the business administration of the project, including meeting financial targets, and ensuring the project meets CQC standards. You will need to liaise with psychiatrists and CMHTs, attending meetings, presenting the project to potential referrers and ensuring records are maintained

to the highest professional standard (Client Reviews, Care Plans, Risk Assessments, Incident Reports, Staff Appraisals etc).

Depending on qualifications and experience you may be asked to contribute to seminars or to lecture on CHT's 2-Year Post Graduate staff training programme in psychotherapy, give papers at conferences or co-author articles for publication in academic journals.

## Person specification

You will have at least 2 years' experience in a similar setting in a clinical role and probably be educated to Master's Degree level in psychology or psychotherapy and will have been in your own training psychotherapy.
