Applications are invited from psychology graduates with a PhD in the area of intellectual disability or developmental psychology for a full time Postdoctoral Research Fellow post of thirty six months duration. The appointee will work in the Cerebra Centre for Neurodevelopmental Disorders in collaboration with the Cognitive Development Research Group and will engage in project management, supervision, collaboration, data collection, data management and analysis on a project entitled: 'Social-cognition and its relation to social development in neurodevelopmental disorders'. The Research Fellow will work under the direction of Prof. Chris Oliver, Prof. Ian Apperly and Dr. Jo Moss at the University of Birmingham and join a team that includes seven PhD students and six Research Fellows\Associates.

The Research Fellow will be based in the Cerebra Centre for Neurodevelopmental Disorders in the School of Psychology, University of Birmingham. The work of the Centre focuses on the problems experienced by people who have neurodevelopmental disorders, particularly those who have severe intellectual disability, genetic syndromes and autism spectrum disorders. The Centre combines the methods of behavioural, clinical and developmental psychology, neuroimaging and cognitive neuroscience.
