Outside In: No Borders

Tullie House and Prism Arts are working in partnership to deliver a 3 month programme of arts workshops designed to engage the community with the Outside In exhibition at Tullie House Museum and Art Gallery. No Borders will comprise of 12 weekly all day (10am-3pm) creative workshop sessions led by professional artists with expertise in delivering workshops with vulnerable people. The project aims to provide new creative opportunities for a variety of different groups including people with learning disabilities, those suffering with dementia and Alzheimer's, individuals with drug and alcohol problems, disabled people and those recovering from strokes or head injuries. These workshops will take place between April and June in Carlisle Library. The workshops are planned and led by the artists using the Outside In exhibition as a starting point. 
Artists Talk

Inside the special exhibitions space. Tickets are free but normal admission charges apply.




Arts and Inclusion Conference
