Wandsworth Museum is looking for freelance artists to develop and lead activities for young people attending the Museum's new afterschool club (Monday evenings 4-5.30pm), which launches in September 2013. The weekly club aims to engage local primary school-aged children with art and culture through a series of art- and history-based activities and projects inspired by the Museum's collection, Wandsworth's built and natural environment, and by other arts and heritage venues in the borough. Participants will work towards either an Explore or Discover Arts Award depending on their ability, and for this they will need to create art work, explore artists, visit other arts organisations and share their work.

The afterschool club is open to children with an additional need (learning, financial, social or behavioural) or who are considered 'at risk'. Experience of working with vulnerable children or adults is essential.

Applicants who meet the job description should submit a CV and a cover letter of up to 700 words, outlining their relevant experience and ideas for workshops they could develop with children aged 8-10 years (including children with SEN) in the 1.5hr weekly club. The workshops should creatively explore subjects that are present in the Museum, which charts the history of Wandsworth over the past 23,000 years. We would welcome applications from any form of visual artist and encourage a variety of creative outputs including painting, drawing, animation, acting, puppetry, sculpture etc.
