Dear colleagues,

The International Network for Cooperation in Mental Health (**i.nez**), the Center for International Health at Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität (**CIH-LMU**), and the Global Mental Health Group, Dept. of Psychiatry at the LMU (**GMHG**) are organizing the 5th International Symposium on "**Global Mental Health - Mental Health in Developing Countries**". We will present an overview of the importance of mental health for developing countries. The symposium is open to all staff and students interested in mental health in developing countries.

More than half a billion people worldwide are suffering from neuropsychiatric disorders or from alcohol or drug dependence. More than 80 % of them are living in developing countries. Most of them do not receive appropriate treatment. Many are stigmatized with prejudices and social exclusion, and their human rights are often violated. All of that can lead to serious psychological, physical, social, and economic damage.

In the least developed countries, children and adolescents represent the largest part of the population. Mental health problems affect 10–20% of children and adolescents worldwide. Despite being a leading cause of health-related disability in this age group, the mental health needs of children and adolescents are grossly neglected. This year's Symposium will be dedicated to child and adolescent mental health. Reports from Africa, Asia and South-America will illustrate various aspects of the problem.
