

3 open postdoctoral positions for 2014

The cluster of excellence (labex) *Pasts in the present : history, heritage, memory* opens 3 one-year postdoctoral positions.

The Cluster of Excellence (labex) *Pasts in the Present: history, heritage, memory* is concerned with the presence of the past in contemporary society. More specifically, the cluster seeks to understand mediations of history in the digital age, politics of memory, social appropriations of the past up- and downstream from heritage policies. It is coordinated by the University Paris Ovest Nanterre La Défense (UPO), in association with the Centre national de la recherche scientifique (CNRS). It unites on the campus of Nanterre University the Maison Archéologie et Ethnologie, René-Ginouvès (MAE), the laboratories Archéologies et sciences de l'antiquité (ArScAn), Préhistoire et technologie, Laboratoire d'ethnologie et de sociologie comparative (LESC), Institut des sciences sociales du politique (ISP), Modèles, dynamiques, corpus (Modyco), the research team Histoire des arts et représentations (HAR), and the Bibliothèque de documentation internationale contemporaine (BDIC). Three major national heritage institutions are also partners : the Bibliothèque nationale de France (BnF), the musée d'Archéologie nationale (MAN), at Saint-Germain-en-Laye, the musée du quai Branly.

The reflection is interdisciplinary and organised in two tightly interdependent fundamental themes. The first, "Connections to the past: representations and assessments," seeks a global analysis of representations of the past from every epic: analysis of the processes of creating heritage or the constitution of collective memory (since Antiquity); studies on public reception of contemporary practices of mediating history; propositions of repositories and of modes of interoperability adapted to mediations of history in the digital age. The second, "Active knowledge of the past: tools and practices of transmission," seeks to make publicly available several categories of new digitized collections relating to ancient, medieval, and contemporary history. Some of these collections concern the history of disciplines, such as, ethnology, archaeology, ethnomusicology, and history of art. This second axis relies on knowledge bases and archives conserved at Paris Ovest (MAE, BDIC, laboratories ArScAn, Préhistoire et technologie, LESC), as well as at the BnF, the MAN, and the Quai Branly Museum.

As part of the general reflection on digital humanities, the labex *Pasts in the Present* seeks to work on the interoperability of these corpuses not only between partners but also with other databases, in order to inscribe them in the Web of Data (Linked Data). This implies modelling catalogues and inventories, using international standards of data representation and of enrichment of the indexing metadata.

For each of these full-time one-year contracts, the postdoctoral researcher is expected to develop during part of his/her working time (1/3 max) a personal research project related to the themes of the labex *Pasts in the Present*.

The three postdoctoral positions are inscribed in the following themes and projects :

1. "Ordinary" conceptions and "vernacular" vocabulary in the mediation of history

This research project is part of the labex larger program on « Connections to the past: representations and assessments ». It questions the mediation of history and the ordinary connections to the past. Most case-studies analyzing the relationship to the past are grounded in a qualitative or ethnographic approach with clearly identified institutions (political party, family, school...) and inscribed in a period of time, or, inversely, punctual interactional situations with heritage institutions (museums, memorials, historical productions).

Both in the continuity of these questions and breaking from these exclusive approaches, this research project aims at evaluating the widest shared contents and forms of connections to the past and the impact of public debates focused on « memory », while reintegrating this analysis with classic sociological questionings. Class membership, religious beliefs, migratory and social trajectories, education level, gender, mobilization context, etc. are thus tackled in this study. The post-doc fellow will be associated to the team of researchers conducting the programme based on qualitative surveys.

Mission :

The applicant is expected to organise and conduct, alongside with the team of researchers, the various steps of the survey.

Required profile

The candidate should hold a PhD in sociology, political sciences, anthropology or history. He/She must have got his/her PhD between June 1st, 2009 and the date of application to this position. His (her) French ought to be fluent. Without being necessarily a specialist of memory or connections to the past issues, he/she should show enough interest on those questions so as to integrate the project from a scientific perspective.

A good experience in qualitative surveys and an appetite for exploring less experienced methodologies on this specific theme (focus groups and projective tests) are expected as well.

2. Reception, use and appropriation of historical exhibitions in a commemorative context

This research project is part of the labex larger program on « Connections to the past: representations and assessments ». For the past ten years, Historical exhibitions have been seen as a tool to favour shared memories, tolerance and citizenship. However, up to now, scholars have almost not studied the social dynamic of their visits. Understanding what happens, and is at stake, during these visits is at the core of this research project. Besides visitors studies field, this perspective tackles general sociological issues such as the transformation of individual representations through time and the way individuals get familiar to the past.

The project has the ambition to draw a new methodological approach of these issues. Given the commemoration of WWI to come in 2014, it will focus on the study of reception, use and appropriation of some of the historical exhibitions scheduled fro 2014, among which the one curated by the Musée de l'Armée and the BDIC, an active participant in this project in addition to the sociologists from the ISP.

Mission

The applicant is expected to coordinate the fieldwork alongside the head of the project and a team of research assistants. He (she) will have to take an active part in the restitution and analysis of the results, including in collective publications.

Required profile

The applicant must be a doctor in sociology, political science or anthropology. He (she) must have earned his (her) PhD between June 1st, 2009 and the date of application to this position. The applicant is expected to have an extensive knowledge of the literature on history museums and *memory studies*. His (her) French ought to be fluent.

An experience in ethnographic field work, if possible with visitors and more broadly an appetite for methodological challenges as well as a capacity to organize teamwork are also expected.

The post-doc fellow will work closely with Sarah Gensburger, a tenured junior researcher at the CNRS and an ISP member.

3. The impact of the archives digitization on social sciences and humanities research

This postdoctoral position is part of the project "Active knowledge of the past: practices and tools of transmission" the second theme of the labex *Pasts in the Present*. Over the last twenty years, the development of collections of humanities and social sciences archives (including their digitization) have created new conditions for research and for the management of documents. Three digital corpora, preserved in the MAE, are the basis of different platform projects implemented under the LABEX. The purpose of the study is to understand the implications of digitization for the use of archives, in research practices, and in ways of thinking/modes of thought. The differences of the three corpora as to the nature of the documents, their processing and their online accessibility will give a comparative dimension to the study. The study could include the practices of consultation of dematerialized archives, accessed by local (intranet) or remote access (internet), by free or controlled access (registration and access code), allowing or not allowing collaborative work.

Mission

The candidate will undertake an ethnography of practice, using surveys and participant observation of the producers and / or of the depositors, of the archival staff, and of the users, (either they are engaged in a scientific project or interested by the resources for any other reasons). The data collected will help the researcher to an epistemological reflection; he or she will also collect information about ongoing work on this issue and will organize a Workshop for the labex. The methodology and contents of the surveys will be established in coordination with S. Blanchy and the three service managers (E. Bellon, A. Julien-Da Cruz Lima, M.-D. Mouton/F. Dubois).

Required profile

The candidate should hold a PhD in anthropology (specialized in anthropology of knowledge) or in sociology, history or philosophy of science, he or she should be proficient in the ethnographic method (observation, interview) and have a good knowledge on archive issues and/or on digital humanities. He (she) must have got his (her) PhD between June 1st, 2009 and the date of application to this position. His (her) French ought to be fluent.

The post-PhD student will work in close collaboration with Sophie Blanchy, Senior researcher of the CNRS (National Centre for Scientific Research) and member of the LESC, UMR 7186.
