Thanks to the initiative of a group of doctoral students of the University of Salamanca with the aim to build a multidisciplinary network of young researchers on indigenous issues, the first edition of EMPI was carried out in 2010 (redempi.blogspot.com.es).

The objective of this **fifth EMPI meeting** to be held at the University of Deusto (Bilbao, Spain) is to offer a multidisciplinary debate on the contemporary issues of **mobility of indigenous peoples**. This field is still under-explored and challenges not only our sociological imagination but also requires innovative solutions in the fields of the socio-economic development and human rights.

The thematic areas of interest for the next meeting are:

- 1) Indigenous identities in migration processes: continuity, transformations and (re) configurations.

- 2) Indigenous frontiers on the move: national and transnational spaces.
- 3) Migrant indigenous associativism: bi-national organizations and ethno-political mobilizations.
- 4) Indigenous migrations in urban and rural contexts.
- 5) Indigenous rights, vulnerability and violence in migration processes and forced relocations.
- 6) Indigenous women, human rights and migration-induced vulnerability.
- 7) Notwithstanding these above-mentioned areas, papers dealing with indigenous peoples in other fields and from other disciplines are equally welcome.

Call for papers & Conference Publication

Paper proposals (max. 300 words) either in English, Spanish or Euskera are welcome to be submitted by email before 20th March 2014 at jornadaempi@gmail.com. A CV summary (max. 100 words) of the author/s shall be included. Those proposals not complying with these requirements will be automatically excluded.

By the first week of April, proposers will be notified whether their proposal has been accepted.

The best 10 papers will be selected to be peer reviewed by the EMPI Scientific Committee, and if approved, published in a conference proceedings book/journal issue.
