Travel expenses bursary will be available for presenters, subject to availability of sufficient funds (transport only – regrettably we are not able to reimburse costs for accommodation). Please inform the organiser at the time of your abstract submission if you wish to claim travel cost reimbursement – you will be provided with a claim form via email.
