Biographies



Born in New Zealand, Jeremy Waldron has been the Chichele Professor of Social and Political Theory and Fellow of All Souls College at Oxford University since 2010 and a Professor of Law at New York University since 2006. He was formerly the Laurence S. Rockefeller University Professor of Politics at Princeton University (1996 to 1997) and Professor of Law at the University of California (1987 to 1996). He was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 1998 and has been a fellow of the British Academy since 2011. Currently, he serves on the editorial boards of *Ratio Juris*, *Legal Theory* and *The Journal of Political Philosophy*. His most extensive body of work is in jurisprudence and political theory including many books and articles on the rule of law, democracy, torture, security and the philosophy of international law. His books include *Dignity, Rank and Rights* (2012), *Partly Laws Common to All Mankind: Foreign Law in American Courts* (2012) and *The Harm of Hate Speech* (2012). His eminent lectures include the Tanner Lectures at Berkeley (2009), the Holmes Lectures at Harvard Law School in 2009 and the Hamlyn Law Lectures in 2011.



Professor Carol Sanger is a leading international scholar on the regulation of abortion, motherhood, and family. She is the Barbara Aronstein Black Professor of Law at Columbia Law School in New York and a Senior Research Fellow at St. Anne's College, Oxford. She taught at the University of Oregon (1979 to 1981) and at Santa Clara University Law School (1985-94). She has also been a visiting scholar at the Institute for Research on Women and Gender at Stanford University (1990 to 1991), visiting professor at Stanford Law School (1991 to 1992) and Columbia Law School (1994 to 1996). She joined Columbia Law School in 1996. In 2001, she was awarded the Columbia University Presidential Teaching Prize. She is a member of the executive board of the Institute for Research on Women and Gender and was a Fellow at the Program on Law and Public Affairs at Princeton University (2003 to 2004). Her teaching areas include Contracts, Family Law and courses focusing on reproduction, the legal profession and law and gender. Her recent scholarship focuses on the regulation of maternal conduct, the regulation of abortion, surrogacy, and law's relation to culture.
