Innovation as a Solution to Societal Challenges

27TH NOVEMBER 2014, LUND, SWEDEN

CIRCLE is celebrating its 10th Anniversary this year. Since its establishment in July 2004, CIRCLE has grown in terms of size and influence. Currently it unites more than 50 researchers, and it has become one of the largest centers in the field of innovation studies, recognized by peers all over the world. Research at CIRCLE covers a range of topics: innovation systems and innovation policy; globalization of innovation; sustainable transitions; innovation and entrepreneurship; innovation, skills and strategies. It aims to understand how innovation can help tackle societal challenges, like economic crises, climate change or increased globalization of innovation activities.

To celebrate our 10th year anniversary, we organize an open seminar on 'Innovation as a Solution to Societal Challenges' which aims to illustrate and discuss what innovation studies as a research field can add to our understanding of and ability to cope with societal challenges. The seminar provides an opportunity to discuss the future of innovation studies performed at CIRCLE and other prominent research organizations in the field. It also allows for interaction with policy makers from Swedish and international organizations and places research results in policy making process. In addition, the opening panel will tell the history of CIRCLE as an organization and reveal the richness of CIRCLE research.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE SEMINAR

The seminar is organized around 5 panel discussions:

- Opening panel: Past, Present and Future of CIRCLE
- Panel I: The Challenge of Recovering and Preventing Economic Crisis
- Panel II: The Challenge of Responding to the Increased Globalization of Economic Activities and Mobility of Talent
- Panel III: The Challenge of Mitigating and Adapting to Climate Change
- Panel IV: Policy Making for Overcoming Societal Challenges – How Can Innovation Studies Help?

Each panel consists of 4-5 panellists who will start the discussion by giving 10 minutes presentation each. It will be followed by discussion with the panellists and the audience.
