

The Exhibition celebrates the 1838 Emancipation of nearly a million Africans in the Caribbean. It tells the key stories in their struggle for freedom and shows how liberation was won. Emancipation was the beginning of a long and laborious journey towards the realisation of the right to self-determination.

The Exhibition has a selection of images and text celebrating acts of courage and resistance which have laid the foundation for the freedom many of us enjoy today. It is the first time that collections from the National Maritime Museum, the Royal Geographical Society (with IBG), the National Archives, and the National Portrait Gallery have been brought together telling Emancipation stories.
