
Map view of people's places of residency, birth and burial











You can view places on a map, or as a list. Here is the map 'zoomed' to Northants/Cambridgeshire




I've clicked on Chelveston's pin, here. Note how you can see the airfield outlines, supplied by English Heritage.



Clicking on 'Chelveston' brings you to its page.

You can see the photos from the Freeman Collection, and more information.

Look at the right-hand-side. We haven't filled all of these parts in for all airfields, and would love for the experts in each airfield's history to do so...



So, let's see what that would look like. Instead of the map, I've searched for an airfield: Duxford.

You can click on this in the same way as the map.



 $\mbox{\sc l}'\mbox{\sc ve}$ filled in some of the detail on Duxford to show you. Compare this to the unfilled-in Chelveston.

Now this page shows I've signed in. I now have an 'edit' box at the top right.

There's also a 'delete enry' button, because I'm signed in as an administrator. Not all accounts will have this, to prevent accidental deletion!




Let's look at the units. Here is a list of units attached to Duxford's page.

We want to make sure that as many of the smaller units have their own pages - not just the Groups and combat squadrons.


If I click 'show all', I get a list of all the units so far attached to Duxford.


Here's the page from the 'Duxford Diary' that begins to unpack the complexity of these extra units...



Keeping it simple, let's look at the 78th Fighter Group. I selected this from Duxford's page, but you could also search for it – there are multiple ways to find what you need.



Scrolling down on the 78^{th} 's page, you can see the component units that made up the 78^{th} .




I'm going to add more information to the $78^{th}{}^{\prime}\!s$ page. I hit 'Edit entry', and just as with places, I get the form.




Now, let's have a look at the bottom of the form. Every time I make a change, I have to add a source message, telling everyone where I got the information that I'm adding.

This is vital/ The site is only as good as the accuracy of the data wee all put in, so we need to demonstrate best practice – source, source, and source again!



Once I've edited my unit, and saved it, any future user can then look at the bottom and see who has edited it, the changes that were made, and the sources they used.


Online is fine, but do attribute. Many of you run magnificent websites, and we want to make sure people link to them, and explore further.




The media section site contains all the photographs currently on the website




Clicking on a photograph will show its caption and give you the option to download it.




If there is only one 'official' IWM caption, only that will show until a user edits it.

I added my revision message at the bottom listing the sources I used




