Dear GCG member,

You are cordially invited to attend the GCG AGM at Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery and the celebratory 40th Anniversary Dinner to be held at the function room of the 'The Old Joint Stock Pub' nearby, on Tuesday 2nd December (details on the booking form).

GCG was founded on 17th May 1974 in Leicester, with its first AGM held in the December of that year by which time it had a membership of 83. The history of the first 34 years of the group can be found in the *Geological Curator* volume 8, number 8. We have traditionally always celebrated our anniversaries: with a 10th anniversary meeting in Leicester; 20th in Northampton; 25th in Leicester again; and the 30th in Scunthorpe. This year we had no May meeting because GCG were jointly involved in the huge SPNHC meeting in Cardiff in June, so we have decided to celebrate it at the AGM this year.

The theme of the associated Seminar in the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery will be *Writing Effective Grant Proposals for Collections Projects*, a subject very relevant to many museums in these difficult days. Speakers for this will include:

We would particularly enjoy meeting up with Brighton Medallists, past committee members, and those who participated in the early days of GCG.

The seminar and AGM will take place on Tuesday 2nd December at the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery, Chamberlain Square, Birmingham, B3 3DH. Refreshments will be provided beforehand and midafternoon. Lunch is <u>not</u> included on either day but can be obtained at a variety of local hostelries. The full programme will be circulated nearer the time, and is anticipated to start around 10.45am, with the AGM at around 4pm. The fee for this day will be £25 for members and £35 for non-members (or you may join GCG for just £15).

The Wednesday meeting will be held at Dudley Museum, with a fee of £10 (or £15 for non-members), and will include morning talks, refreshments, and a chance to see the displays, followed by an afternoon boat trip through the Limestone Caverns, and possible excursion to the Wren's Nest site.
