We wish to appoint a Research and Teaching Fellow in Economic Geology, starting on 2nd March 2015, or as soon as possible thereafter, for a period of two years.

Research and teaching in the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences addresses fundamental questions about the behaviour of the solid Earth, its biosphere, atmosphere and oceans, from the present through to Deep Time. We are aiming to enhance that and expand our portfolio into the general area of economic and resource geology by appointing a Research and Teaching Fellow in Economic Geology.

The successful candidate will contribute to the development, teaching, and management of the Department's undergraduate and taught postgraduate programmes, and will have completed, or be about to complete, a PhD in Economic Geology or closely related field. Preference will be given to candidates who possess a demonstrated ability to communicate effectively and who can teach sedimentary, as well as igneous and metamorphic, economic geology. The successful candidate will also be expected to undertake research in their field of expertise. Previous teaching experience is desired but not required. The Department runs two BSc Honours programmes in Geology and Environmental Earth Sciences and an integrated Masters (MGeol) degree in Earth Science, and is currently developing a new taught MSc degree programme.
