The Department also aims to be at the forefront of educational changes and offers a wide range of programmes and services for teachers of learners with special needs, and for practitioners and families. The Department is equipped with cutting-edge research equipment including an 256-channel EEG system and has close collaboration with local neuroimaging centres.

The Department is now seeking academics excited by the prospect of contributing their expertise in the area of educational and developmental neuroscience.
