Study circle objectives: At the end of the study circle, participants will be able to:

Describe these key facets of vocabulary learning

- The importance of vocabulary in second language (L2) learning
- How the number of words in someone's lexicon is counted
- How many words a native speaker of a language knows at various ages
- What it means to know a word
- Number of words an L2 learner needs to orally communicate effectively
- Number of words an L2 learner needs to know to read
- How long it takes for an L2 learner to learn enough vocabulary to communicate, comprehend, read, and write at the various Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) levels
- Analyse and evaluate ways in which L2 learners develop vocabulary from listening, observing, (e.g. fast mapping), and reading
- Compare vocabulary learning of child and educated L2 learners in mainstream research with the LESLLA learners with whom they work
