

To commemorate the William Smith bicentenary, the Geological Society of London's History of Geology Group (HOGG), is planning to reproduce a limited edition of the *Memoir* that accompanied Smith's 1815 map: *A Memoir to the Map and Delineation of the Strata of England and Wales, with part of Scotland.*

This limited edition of **only 200 copies** will be published on **1 August 2015**, exactly 200 years to the day after publication of the original. In true Smithian tradition, **subscribers** will be sought for this edition and, as in the original, copies will contain the **names of all subscribers**, with their affiliations. Each copy will also be **hand-numbered**.

The volume will be enhanced by an **introduction** written by **Tom Sharpe**, an expert on the many editions of Smith's map, and **Professor Hugh Torrens**, the authority on Smith's life and works.

This **luxury case-bound edition** with marbled end papers will replicate the content of the first issue of the *Memoir* and will thus contain a copy of the hand-coloured Table II, an *Explanation of the Colours on the Map of Strata*. A copy of the more comprehensive *Geological Table of British Organized Fossils* from a later issue will also be included, in a pocket at the back. The title will be **gold embossed** on the spine and the book will look similar to the images shown here (although the cover colour may change).

The price will be £30, plus packing and postage, but at this stage we are just trying to gauge the



level of interest there might be.
