They have been addressing HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, and most recently, Ebola.

Dr. Farmer has also written extensively on health and human rights, about the role of social inequalities in the distribution and outcome of infectious diseases, and about global health.

The “Kapuscinski Development Lectures” are named after [Ryszard Kapuscinski](#), an acclaimed Polish journalist and writer who covered developing countries.
