Analytics are now a well established multidimensional field of study and an area of application which has attracted much interest in recent years. It has been successful in many ways and is now a subject of academic study in Computer Science, Information Management, Knowledge Management, Intellectual Capital, Investment Analysis, and Corporate Strategy to mention only a few areas.

ICAS 2015 aims to bring researchers and practitioners in analytics from these different disciplines and more together.

Analytics has evolved from what originally was called management science and operations research to a multidisciplinary and multi-application field that in addition to mathematical modelling and statistical methods, includes data mining, applied modelling, actuary science, technology development, total quality management, Six Sigma, Lean Analysis, constraints theory and various aspects of risk management. The difference now is that there is an increased awareness that individuals are doing analytics work in their own chosen field of study. This is due to many factors, including access to better technology and a realisation of the need for Analytics to be applied to deliver solutions to problems. This has resulted in some stove piping which ICAS is designed to alleviate.

Some of the areas that we aim to address in the conference include how analytics can help to manage Big Data, how statistical methods on computers have improved and how machine learning has contributed to data analytics. We welcome research into various fields including marketing analytics, web semantics and analytics and data vizualisation.

ICAS brings together researchers using Analytics from any field of study as well as practitioners involved in the application of Analytics techniques to share ideas about the research and application of this subject.



Non-Academic Contributions; Contributions from individuals and organisations working in the field. These contributions can take the form of a presentation or a demonstration.

Round Table Proposals; Topical subjects proposed for discussion.

Submission details

Abstracts: All submission types require an abstract in the first instance. The Abstract should be a minimum

of 300 and no more than 500 words including up to five keywords and keyphrases to be received

by 9 March 2015. Please read the Abstract Guidelines before submitting.

Submission: Online via the <u>submission form</u>. Please ensure that you complete all relevant sections of the

form, including the conference track the abstract is intended for, the proposed title for the paper, the full names (first name and surname, not initials) and email addresses of all authors and a postal address and telephone number for at least one contact author. Full paper: Only required after acceptance of abstract and not to be more than 5,000 words including

abstract, keywords and references. Submission date will be **no later than 7 May 2015**. Please read the style guidelines document. Papers should be submitted as .doc or .rtf file attachments by email to the Conference Manager, <u>Jo Green</u> with the <u>submission checklist and copyright</u>

form..

Due to the large number of papers expected for this conference, the committee prefers that an author presents only one paper. However, if multiple papers are accepted for publication and presentation, each paper requires a separate registration fee. Author registration and payment must be completed by **24 August 2015** and there are special <u>discounts</u> available for earlybird registration and group bookings, including a special reduced rate for supervisors and students

attending together.

All full papers will be double-blind reviewed by members of the conference committee to ensure an adequate standard, that the proposed subject of their abstract has been followed, that the paper is of a suitable length, the standard of English is adequate and the paper is appropriately referenced.
