

# Implementation Science Masterclass 2015

The Masterclass includes lectures, group work and guidance to help participants work more effectively on their own implementation projects.

The course is led by implementation science experts from all over the world, including Brian Mittman (USA), John Øvretveit (Sweden), Nick Sevdalis (UK), Rahul Shidhaye (India), Sharon Straus (Canada) and Graham Thornicroft (UK).
