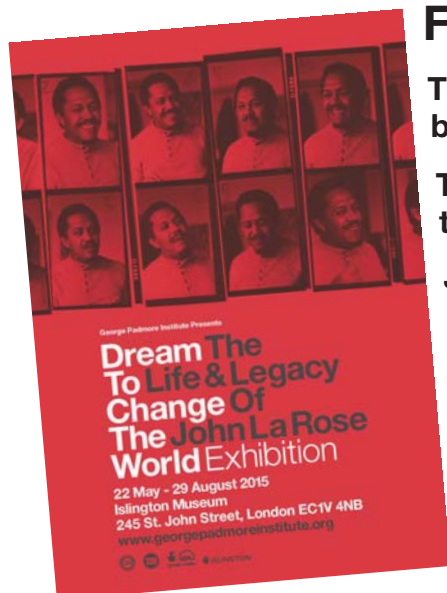
The George Padmore Institute is organising three public events to take place at the Islington Museum
