**Special issue: Gendered
experiences in
developmental pathways**

We are seeking expressions of interest for papers on the role of gender and developmental offending pathways across the life-course. Extant research has established that predictors of offending are largely the same for males and females. Despite this, there are unique experiences and contexts that shape offending pathways for males and females.

A number of questions surround the issue of gender and offending behavior across the life-course. Some examples, include:

- how does current research examine and understand gendered offending pathways across the lifecourse?
- what are the key inter-sectionalities by gender that shape offending pathways?
- what developmental pathways are common and uncommon by gender and what are the associated implications for research, theory, policy and practice?

This special issue will bring together a range of papers that will seek to examine uncover gendered experiences in offending across the life-course.

Papers from criminology and other related disciplines such as psychology, statistics, sociology, neuroscience, geography, political science, social work, epidemiology, and public health are welcome.

Successful submissions will then be invited to submit a full paper which will undergo the usual review process for the journal. An invitation for submission of full paper does not guarantee publication in the special issue.
