## **Scholarly Communications Officer**

In this post you will be responsible for the development of a scholarly publishing advice service and support colleagues in facilitating Gold open access publishing. This is an exciting role in a developing area, with the increasing adoption of funder open access mandates and a national focus on access to publicly funded research. You will also provide consultation and advice to researchers in the area of scholarly communications including routes to open access, publisher policies, copyright and research dissemination.

You will be part of the Research Support Services team and assist in the delivery of a range of research support activities. You will also help promote the services provided by the team and the Library to a range of LSE user groups via continuous service development, advocacy programmes and engagement with our users.

You will be educated to at least degree level or equivalent with strong awareness of emerging trends in scholarly communications and research support. You should be an excellent communicator with a proven ability to relate to a wide range of users, academic colleagues and external networks. You will be able to work under pressure and on your own initiative as well as being an effective team member. Experience of working in scholarly publishing would be an advantage.
