
THE AVA - DAVID MARR MEDAL - 2016

ANNOUNCEMENT & CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The AVA awards, normally every two years, a medal recognizing the achievements of an outstanding vision scientist in the early part of his or her research career. The award is called *the David Marr medal*, in memory of one of Britain's most distinguished vision researchers. Following the successful launch of the award in 2008, this notice is a call for nominations for the 2016 award.

Nomination

Nominees will normally be scientists who are conducting vision research in an EU country, and who completed their PhD no more than 10 years ago. More precisely: for the 2016 award, nominees should have submitted their PhD on or after Jan 1st 2005**.

Nominations (but not self-nominations) are invited from AVA members, and should include:

- a letter of recommendation
- the nominee's CV (with list of publications)
- two example publications (PDF files).

Any eligible vision scientist may be nominated, whether nominated previously or not.

The Award

The winner of the 2016 award will be announced in mid March 2016. He or she will be invited to receive it and to give a talk, at the AVA Spring meeting or Christmas meeting 2016.
