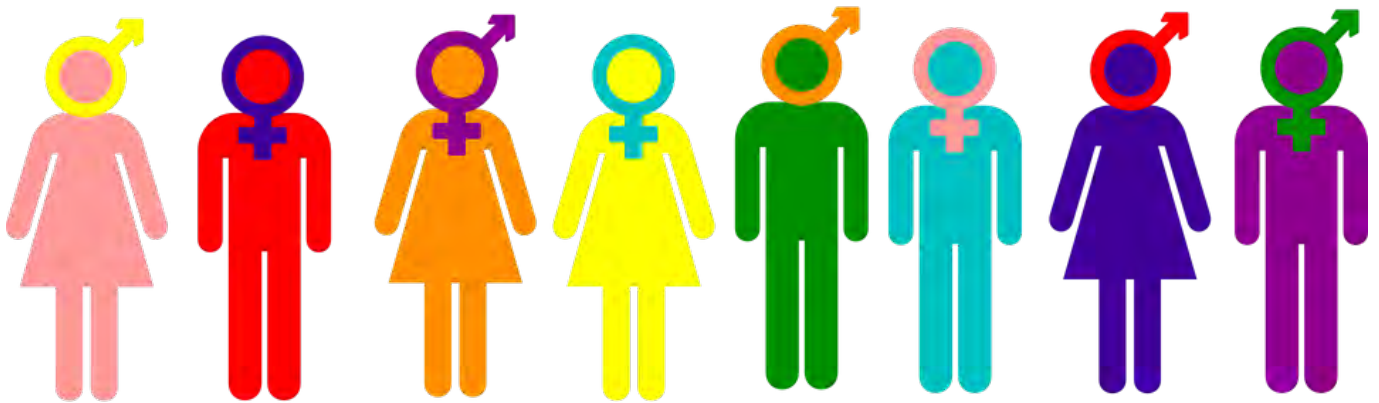


Are you politically and socially engaged?

MA in Gender Studies.



The course is taken over one calendar year (two years part-time) and gives an advanced grounding in theory and methodology with the opportunity to follow your specialist interests through the options system and your dissertation research project. You will gain fresh perspectives on new and familiar topics in the area of gender and sexuality, and learn to think for yourself at postgraduate level in an encouraging and supportive environment. Classes are taught by a diverse group of faculty, many of whom are leaders in their fields.

The MA is affiliated to the Sussex Research Centre for Gender Studies, a vibrant community of scholars engaged in cutting-edge research on gender issues across disciplines such as Sociology, Criminology, Law, Politics, Anthropology, Education, Media Studies and English Literature. Our work on topics such as 'lad culture' and gendered hate crime has won awards for its social impact, and we have close relationships with community groups in the areas of gendered/sexual violence, sex workers' rights, and LGBT equality.
