



Founded in 1919, AUC moved to a new 270-acre state-of-the-art campus in New Cairo in 2008. The University also operates in its historic downtown facilities, offering cultural events, graduate classes, and continuing education. Student housing is available in New Cairo. Among the premier universities in the region, AUC is Middle States accredited; its Engineering programs are accredited by ABET, its Chemistry program is accredited by the Canadian Society for Chemistry, and the School of Business is accredited by AACSB, AMBA and EQUIS. The AUC Libraries contain the largest English-language research collection in the region and are an active and integral part of the University's pursuit of excellence in all academic and scholarly programs. AUC is an English-medium institution; eighty-five percent of the students are Egyptian and the rest include students from nearly ninety countries, principally from the Middle East, Africa and North America. Faculty salary and rank are based on qualifications and professional experience. According to AUC policies and procedures, all faculty are entitled to generous benefits.

Job Description:

The Department of Sociology, Anthropology, Psychology, and Egyptology welcomes applications for a full-time tenure-track position in the field of Community Psychology, to begin in Fall 2017. The candidate is expected to teach theoretical and skills-building undergraduate and graduate courses related to general psychology, community psychology, and methodology. The Psychology Unit currently offers an advanced undergraduate track and a Master of Arts in Community Psychology. The candidate will be an active participant in these programs, supervising Master's theses and building partnerships with local and international community organizations. The candidate should also conduct research and play an active role in the department, the school, and university service activities.

Requirements:

Candidates should hold a PhD or equivalent, and have a specialization in Community Psychology or related field. Successful candidates should have an ongoing program of research and publication, have strong leadership capability or potential, and skills or potential in high quality teaching. Candidates with research interests that are relevant to the region and show intradisciplinary or interdisciplinary links are preferred. Candidates with expertise related to prevention and intervention program development are preferred.
