



The project

SOCCES – **SOC**ial Competences, Entrepreneurship and Sense of initiative development and assessment framework is an Erasmus+ project, run by 7 partners from 6 countries.

The aim of SOCCES is to develop and pilot a **framework for the assessment of two transversal competences** that are very important for working life, namely: **Sense of Initiative and Entrepreneurship, and Social competences**

Why does the work of the project matter?

The **European framework for key competences** (ANC 2006/962/EC), identifies 8 key competences for living and working in our knowledge-based society, however according to EACEA/Eurydice (2012)ⁱ, while the status of the basic competences (e.g., mathematics, science and technology competences) is well established, the development of the curricula and assessment of transversal competences (e.g., civic, social or entrepreneurship competences) is lagging behind. This presents a challenge for higher education practice that this project tackles in a practical, inclusive way.

What does this project offer?

Systematic approaches to developing these competences require effective means of assessing them – diagnostically, formatively, summatively and for certification purposes.

This project provides **teachers** with the means to:

- Define and describe these entrepreneurial and social competences for their students
- Support students with the development of these competences in an inclusive, virtually enabled setting
- Assess and provide feedback to their students on how they are progressing in the development of entrepreneurial and social competences

And it provides learners with:

- The means to describe, benchmark and self-assess their entrepreneurial and social competences
- The language to articulate these competences to others such as teachers and employers
- A means to develop with them in an accessible, virtually enabled environment

A set of guidelines and recommendations that teachers can use to develop or evaluate learning content or teacher training programs.
