SUGGESTED TOPICS

Papers or posters should be related to the conference aims:



- Explore the nature of relationships within families in connection with various types of nutritive and nurturing behavior in infancy and childhood
- Enhance understanding of the complex interactions between socio-cultural, psychological, and biological factors in the nurture of infant and child
- Illuminate socio-cultural, political, and economic influences upon infant and child feeding practices
- Increase understandings of breastfeeding as a bio-psychosocial activity
- Focus on key initiatives that may impact upon practices related to nurturing the preterm infant and the family
- Explore research findings or current trends that impact clinical practice, program development, funding and policy in breastfeeding and human lactation
- Describe current trends in promoting, supporting and/or protecting breastfeeding
- Increase and expand knowledge regarding lactation

GUIDELINES

Proposals must be received by **May 15, 2017**. Authors selected for presentation will be notified by **July 1, 2017**, and will be requested to submit additional materials. Applicants are responsible for all conference-related expenses. Presenters receive a substantially-reduced registration fee for the core conference.

Workshop proposals and poster session proposals should include:

- A cover page that contains
 - * TITLE
 - * NAMES OF ALL AUTHORS and their degrees and institutional affiliations
 - * the name of the CORRESPONDING AUTHOR MAKING THE PRESENTATION (including postal address, phone number, email, and a short biography)
 - whether the proposal represents a contribution to THEORY, COMPETED WORK, WORK IN PROGRESS, OR PROPOSED WORK
 - * the PRESENTATION FORMAT (oral, poster, either or both)
- A second page that contains ONLY the title of the proposed presentation and a 500 to 750 word, single-spaced abstract in size 12 type with a 1" margin on all sides.
- The abstract may contain an introduction, methods, results and conclusions
- A curriculum vitae or resume for each of the authors
- A typed bibliography for the abstract
- A list of all related funding sources
