The Role

- Independently seek funding from government and non-government organisations by developing relationships, promoting research ideas, and writing research proposals.
- Build skills and capacity within our health technology assessment team.
- Contribute to external engagement activities including academic conferences, Thought Leadership events, print and social media.
- Develop and lead training programs delivered to government and non-government organisations.
- Supervise Masters and PhD students.
- Contribute to developing and implementing the strategic direction of MUCHE.

Selection Criteria

To be considered for this position applications must respond to the selection criteria below and attach as a separate document in the application process.

- A PhD in economic, econometrics or closely related quantitative field.
- Experience in undertaking health technology assessment.
- Demonstrated ability to independently attract research funding.
- Outstanding academic record with a strong list of published work in top journals.
- Ability to work independently with high level organisational skills.
- Ability to work within collaborative teams towards mutual goals.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills.
- Willingness to represent MUCHE at external seminars and Thought Leadership events.

Desirable selection criteria:

- Has made an independent and original contribution to research with significant impact.
- Proven track record in successfully managing small research teams.
- Experience working with government and non-government organisations.

Salary Package: from \$121,953 - \$140,246 (Level C) to \$146,462 – 161,099 (Level D) plus 17% employer's superannuation and annual leave loading. There is also a potential for an additional Salary Loading for candidates with exceptional skills and experience.
