Seeking Interventions Section Editor

MAT invites applications for the position of Interventions Section Editor. In this section we publish short articles (2–5k words) that are focused on public health and development interventions, the challenges of working across disciplines and organizations, and the complexities of conducting research and effecting change through projects involving a range of partners with sometimes conflicting interests. The ideal candidate would be broadly trained in medical anthropology and familiar with critical global health and critical development studies. We are looking for someone who is savvy regarding the sensitivities of publishing on these issues, who is organized and self-disciplined, and who has strong writing and editing skills. Candidates from the global South are especially encouraged to apply.

This is a great position for people interested in online and open-access publishing, and working with a dynamic international group of editors and staff. The position requires approximately 10–15 hours per month, on average, though this varies depending on the production cycle. This three-year term will begin in July 2017. Applications are due by 10 June (details below).

The Section Editor's responsibilities include:

- responding to inquiries and soliciting submissions
- identifying and inviting peer reviewers
- providing feedback on content, clarity, and style
- ensuring that reviews and edits are completed in a timely manner
- attending bimonthly editorial meetings via Skype (on Amsterdam time)

MAT is an online, open-access journal that publishes research and theory in medical anthropology, science studies, critical global health studies, and history of medicine. The goal is to stimulate broad and global conversations about pressing issues in the field. The journal includes traditional sections such as peer-reviewed articles and reviews, as well as a variety of other essays and reports.
