The Fossils in Shropshire Project has been working in partnership with the Museum to maintain access to its geological collections in the Shropshire Museums Service Resource Centre at Ludlow despite drastic cuts in local authority funding. Come to this seminar to find out how, mainly with the help of volunteers, the collections at Ludlow are being conserved, digitised and made widely available through various portals including the NHM Data Portal.

The project is actively engaging the local community via volunteers, social media as well as outreach events such as exhibitions, talks and walks. The long term aim is to support a wide range of collections-based educational and research activities even if physical access later becomes difficult or impossible.
