Another point of interest is to critically reflect on the research terminology associated with classifying mobility (e.g. forced migrant, client, refugee, asylum seeker); what does the use of these terms in research reproduce and should we as researchers problematise and re-assign new meanings or look at creating new analytical tools? The presenters will discuss these issues in relation to their fieldsites and their theoretical interests on temporality.*
