Michal Krumer-Nevo (Ben-Gurion University), who will explore the idea of poverty-aware social work practice.

Presentations: will include contributions from Anna Gupta (Royal Holloway, University of London), June Thoburn (UEA) and Laurie Day (ECORYS) who will speak on the Troubled Families initiative.

Panel discussion: The conference will close with questions to, and responses from, partners in local services and projects, including Ashiana, Asylum Matters, The Children's Society and The Welcome Centre.

We look forward to welcoming you to our conference to hear about recent research and practice developments, engage in discussions and reflection, to network and develop new possibilities for collaboration.
