Temporary Employment

The Academic Service, and more specifically the Language Centre, is seeking an experienced language teacher for a thirteen-month period from September 2018 until September 2019.

Most of the work requires expertise in English for Academic Purposes (EAP)/Academic Literacies and experience in providing academic skills support to Early Career Researchers in the Social Sciences.

Function description

The candidate will cover a wide range of competences of which the most important are:

 Teaching academic writing skills and academic presentation skills to researchers and fellows (native- and non-native-speaking) at doctoral and post-doctoral level

- Giving genre-based workshops such as emails, personal statements, using corpora for research writing, etc.
- Facilitating Academic Writers' Groups for researchers
- Individual coaching
- Revising linguistic aspects of researchers' in-house papers and research articles
- Working closely with the Max Weber Programme (Academic Communications Unit) to support fellows, e.g. academic presentation skills, research writing, honing job talk skills, etc.
- Team-teaching on the Introduction to Teaching in Higher Education course and follow-up teaching practice sessions
- Placement testing of candidate researchers to the EUI
- Placement testing for EUI competitions

Requirements

Candidates should have:

- A postgraduate qualification or teaching certificate
- Experience in teaching post-graduate and post-doctoral researchers in the Social Sciences
- Preferably teaching experience in an international setting

The EUI offers

Contract agent positon - GFIV (basic monthly salary of EUR.2,770.59) for a duration of 1 year, non-renewable.

On top of this the staff member is entitled to:

- Travel expenses on entry into service: a flat-rate payment based on an allowance per kilometer of the distance between Florence and the place of recruitment
- Daily subsistence allowance: payment of a daily subsistence allowance for 120 days from entry into service
- Health coverage (JSIS)

Depending on their personal situation, the staff member can receive:
