

Call for Nominations:

Surveillance Studies Network Book Award: 2018

The Surveillance Studies Network (SSN) invites nominations (including self-nominations) for the annual Surveillance Studies Book Award.

The award is given in recognition of an outstanding monograph on surveillance published during the preceding year.

We are currently inviting nominations for **2018** (*books with a '2017' copyright date).

Single or multi-authored works are eligible, but not edited volumes.

The winner/s will be announced in late 2018.

The winner/s will be honored at the 2020 SSN conference.

The deadline for nominations and the receipt of three (3) books from the publisher is **9th July 2017**. Please note, books will not be returned.

Please include the title of the book, year of publication, author, publishing house, and a paragraph of no more than 300 words detailing specifics about why this book would be suitable for the award.
