In recent years, Latin America has experienced deep political, economic and cultural transformations such as new migration flows, the strengthening of indigenous claims, and the recent 'feminist waves' –to name just a few– that have had strong impacts on social relationships. This seminar invites researchers interested in ongoing transformations on gender, indigeneity, migration, politics, territorial identities and beyond. The seminar will interrogate contemporary processes in Chile and Latin America considering local, regional and global transformations.

Our confirmed guest speaker is Professor Maxine Molyneux, Professor of Sociology at University College of London. She has held posts at the Institute of Latin American Studies, at the Politics and Sociology Department of Birkbeck College and the Sociology Department of Essex University, among others. She has written extensively in the fields of political sociology, gender and development, human rights and social policy; and has acted as senior adviser, consultant and researcher to UNRISD, UNIFEM and UN Women, among others.
