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WHAT IS CLEAN GROWTH?

WHAT IS CLEAN GROWTH AND WHY IS IT AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE UK?

Clean growth means growing our national income while cutting greenhouse gas emissions.

The UK is well placed to take advantage of this economic opportunity. Our early action on clean growth means that we have nurtured a broad range of low carbon industries, with some in world leading positions, which is why the <u>Clean Growth Grand Challenge</u> is at the heart of our modern Industrial Strategy.

5 REASONS TO BE EXCITED ABOUT CLEAN GROWTH



Over **86%** of the projected **\$11.5** trillion investment in global power generation over the next three decades is expected to be in **low carbon resources**.

Over 50% of global car sales are projected to be electric vehicles by 2040.

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WHY ACT ON CLIMATE CHANGE?

When holding your event, you may want to share some facts on climate change with your audience.

WHAT IS CLIMATE CHANGE?

Rising levels of carbon dioxide, and other gases such as methane, trap the sun's energy in the atmosphere and cause the planet to heat up – the greenhouse effect.

The higher the amounts of greenhouse gases, the warmer the Earth becomes. As the climate changes, the frequency of some extreme weather events, such as heatwaves and floods in the UK, is increasing.

CHANGE IS HAPPENING...

Average temperatures at the Earth's surface have risen by more than 1°C since the pre-industrial period.

Overwhelmingly scientists agree that climate change is happening with human activity as the main cause.

UK



Extreme Weather

Between November 2015 and January 2016 we had the most extreme and severe floods on record, due to extremely high amounts of rain leading to an estimated £1.6 billion of damage

Health

Heat related deaths in the UK are projected to increase by 45% by the 2020s and by 167% by 2050

Food

Climate change will **impact food availability** through reductions in crop yield due to increased temperatures, changes in rainfall patterns, and an increased risk of drought and flooding

AROUND THE WORLD



The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change says a 1.5°C average rise may put 20-30% of species at risk of extinction. If the planet warms by more than 3°C, most ecosystems will struggle

Economic

Globally, extreme weather events caused an estimated \$660 billion of economic damage between 2001 and 2010; 54% higher than the previous decade



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THE UK'S LOW CARBON ECONOMY

The growth in the UK's low carbon economy has taken place across the country with centres of excellence in many parts of the UK

NORTHERN IRELAND •

The value of the low carbon economy was almost £1 billion in 2016, supporting 6,000 jobs and 9,000 businesses

MIDLANDS •

Leading region for the design and manufacture of low carbon vehicles, with more than £1.5 billion (over 60%) of UK automotive R&D carried out in the region

WALES •

The value of the low carbon economy was £2.4 billion in 2016, supporting 13,000 jobs and 9,000 businesses

SOUTH WEST •

The low carbon sector in Bristol employs over 13,000 people with over 34,000 jobs in the whole of the West of England

SCOTLAND

The value of the low carbon economy was £5.8 billion in 2016, supporting 24,000 jobs and 9,000 businesses

→ NORTH

Low carbon investment has encouraged innovation and the generation of clean energy, and developed local supply chains, all of which has helped drive regeneration

NORTH WEST

The low carbon economy supports 80,500 jobs in the region

→ SOUTH EAST

The low carbon economy in Oxfordshire has a turnover of £1.15 billion supporting 8,800 jobs and represents 7% of the local economy

2008



The UK was the first country to introduce legally binding emission reduction targets through the Climate Change Act

2009



The Government publishes the Low Carbon Transition Plan

2011



The government publishes the carbon plan

2012



The UK overachieves its emissions target and reduces its greenhouse gases by 25% against 1990 levels

2013



Electricity Market Reform introduced, driving the £110 billion of investment needed by 2020 to ensure reliable, diverse and low carbon power

2015



The UK played a leading role in securing the agreement of 195 countries to sign up to the historic Paris Climate Agreement

2017



For the first time in history, low carbon energy sources supplied 50% of the UK's electricity



The UK publishes the Clean Growth Strategy

2018



The UK produces electricity without burning coal for a record 76 hours

Climate Change Act

The Climate Change Act 2008 is an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom. The Act sets up a framework for the UK to achieve its long-term goals of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and to ensure steps are taken towards adapting to the impact of climate change.

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Here are some tips to help you make sure events are safe and accessible:



Ensure attendees at your event know where the **fire exits** are



Consider whether your venue has stair free access and adequate toilets



If your event involves Audio
Visual presentations, check if
your venue has an induction loop
facility for hearing aid users or
if you are posting a video online,
put subtitles on your video!



Use an event management tool, such as Eventbrite to organise your attendees and make sure your event isn't overcrowded



Avoid using jargon and complicated language and encourage people not to speak over each other



Ask attendees beforehand whether they have any accessibility requirements, so you can best cater for their needs


