## 2<sup>nd</sup> International Conference on Sindh Studies

### *“Indus Valley Cultural Heritage: New Researches and Perspectives”*

Cultural Heritage is an emerging interdisciplinary field of study, and its inquiry has increasingly been recognized as an important arena by scholars, practitioners, and institutions. The scholarship recognizes that cultural heritage – in its many different forms and alternative expressions – constitutes an influential force in the socio-cultural and political, economic and religious dynamics of state and society. In academic and policy narratives, cultural heritage is now getting a great deal of attention worldwide. In recent years, the new theoretical and methodological approaches have helped to introduce and reshape the diverse scholarly narratives, policy and activist practices in the emerging interdisciplinary field of critical heritage studies.

Against this backdrop, the Second International Conference on Sindh Studies 2018 *‘Cultural Heritage: New Researches and Perspectives’* aims to critically examine and contribute to the advancement of critical knowledge on cultural heritage by drawing on the expertise from a range of disciplines including anthropology, archaeology, ethnomusicology, heritage studies, culture studies, visual and performance studies, media studies, architecture, art, literature, language, history, psychology, sociology, and tourism. The Conference envisages the inclusive idea of investigating the Indus valley cultural heritage in its wider historical, transcultural geographic boundaries which includes the whole Indo-Pak subcontinent and ancient Silk road.
