1. Introduction

As part of the Sporting Heritage & the Armed Forces project, the Army Museums Ogilby Trust (AMOT) wishes to appoint an experienced freelance KS2 & KS3 learning specialist to work with partners across the AMOT and Sporting Heritage network and their schools audience to develop 2 resources which will be available for heritage learning professionals across the sector.

The **Sporting Heritage & the Armed Forces project** is a two year funded project (May 2018 – April 2020) led by AMOT and Sporting Heritage CIC. These two organisations have chosen to work together to build on their existing partnership activity, to deliver a programme that will develop a greater understanding of the relationship between sport and the armed forces in the UK. To date, little activity has been delivered to gain a greater understanding of how important the two fields are to each other, and how their histories and heritage are often intrinsically linked.

Through a series of localised partnerships between museums, community organisations, schools, sporting organisations and the armed forces, the Sporting Heritage & the Armed Forces project will create a programme of activity which opens up museums, archives and wider collections to new and different audiences, making these collections relevant to the communities they serve. As part of this programme we are creating a range of online resources which can be utilised by heritage professionals across both networks including 2 cross curricular learning resources aimed at KS2 and KS3 pupils.

2. Purpose of the brief

The purpose of the brief is to:

- Undertake desk based research and a limited number of site visits to museums from both networks to ascertain the range of collection material and heritage stories available for use in a learning resource.
- Develop 2 cross curricular learning resources that are differentiated for KS2 pupils and KS3 pupils. The shape of these resources will be determined by the freelance specialist and as a result of the research undertaken as part of this brief but could take the form, although not be limited to, a detailed session outline plus 2d, 3d or digital resources and teacher's pack. We are looking for an approach to these resources which can be adapted for a range of sports for

example a resource which may focus on one particular team sport but that could be adapted for another team game.

- Pilot both these resources with KS2 and KS3 pupils, collecting feedback from the pupils, school teachers and heritage professionals. This evaluation will inform the final development of the resources.
- Present the final resources in a format suitable for uploading online.

3. Role

We are looking for an experienced KS2 & KS3 learning specialist with a good knowledge of the KS2 and KS3 curriculum and a track record of developing engaging and inspiring learning resources. As a freelance role the specialist will be required to work independently but will be expected to work at times in consultation with representatives from the AMOT and Sporting Heritage Networks and with school teachers. The role will report to the Sporting Heritage & the Armed Forces Event Co-ordinator.

4. Outputs

The expected outputs from the work are:

- At least 12 days work to include the research, development, piloting and formatting of the two learning resources.
- Willingness in principal to present the resources at the Sporting Heritage & the Armed Forces spring showcase (February – date tbc). Fee for this to be agreed separately.

5. Timescale

Following appointment the KS2 & KS3 learning specialist will be expected to deliver at least 12 days work, for the total sum quoted, over the period between September 2018 – February 2019.

6. Copyright

The copyright holder for any material produced by the KS2 & KS3 learning specialist during the course of the project will jointly be the Army Museums Ogilby Trust and Sporting Heritage CIC.

7. Location

The person appointed will work from their own premises but will be expected to travel to meetings. The contract requires access to the internet, a phone line and the ability to travel.

8. Remuneration

The fixed fee for the contract is £3,000 inclusive of VAT and expenses. The appointed person will be responsible for their own National Insurance and Tax.

Payment schedule:

Payment 1 – September 2018	50% upon initiation of commission
Payment 2 – February 2019	50% up completion of the work

All invoices will be processed by the Army Museums Ogilby Trust.
