Do you want to plan your own project and conduct fieldwork in an unfamiliar setting, at home or abroad? If so, the master's programme in Social Anthropology is the right choice for you.

Learning outcomes

The master's programme in Social Anthropology teaches you how anthropologists have developed theoretical and methodological tools for conducting empirically grounded studies of people's lives and contemporary social issues. You learn to apply the tools yourself through designing your own research project, carrying out ethnographic fieldwork and analysing qualitative research data.

Two specializations and independent fieldwork

The programme offers two tracks of specialization in Contemporary Ethnography and Global Political Economy and both specializations include fieldwork of one semester. As a master's student you get the rare opportunity to choose the destination for your fieldwork, based on the topic of your thesis and undertake independent fieldwork of up to six months. The data you collect will form the basis of your master's thesis. Our master's students travel to all parts of the world, from Norwegian towns and villages, to New York, South Africa and Pacific islands. Our researchers have many exciting projects you can join.
