The diversity and plurality of discourse, practice and knowledge production in Muslim societies tend to inform and manifest the competing voices and nature of various epistemological, performative, cultural, social and political structures. Most importantly, the pluralization of narratives, practices and knowledge production in Muslim cultures help support the idea of the formation of plural public sphere and disentangle the singular and exclusivist view of Muslim society. In the formation of the plurality of voices and public sphere in Muslim societies, the Sufi discourses, practices and performances are inscribed prominently that tend to formulate the critical knowledge, alternative identities and subjectivities. In the current age of globalisation, new digital and social media, the visibility of Sufism is increasingly observed in the forms of domestic and diasporic, regional and vernacular Sufi organisations, narratives and practices. The Sufi culture's influence on and inspiration from various global/South Asian religious-cultural traditions in Indo-Pakistani context is also an important feature to be explored the plurality and diversity within Muslim societies and cultures through anthropological, sociological, ethnomusicological, historical concepts and methods, literary and artistic expressions. By articulating Sufi heritage in the plurality of discourse and knowledge, the conference also critically reflects on the idea of decoloniality within Islam.

To further conceptualise the presence and contributions of Sufi heritage and knowledge production, <u>Sindh Culture</u>, <u>Tourism and Antiquities Department</u>, <u>Provincial Government of Sindh</u>, <u>Pakistan</u> announces a two-day annual interdisciplinary 05th International Sufi Heritage Conference 2019 (May 03 – 04) in Karachi, Sindh, Pakistan.
